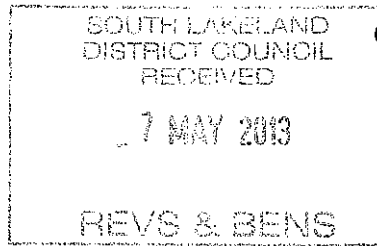

Dear Sir,

I believe the "housing need" of Grange-over-Sands to be flawed. This "need" being based on a questionnaire returned by less than 20% of Grange households in 2001.

The Land Allocation Plan does not address issues of traffic bottle necks. Most new residents seeking employment will need to travel to local towns by Kendal, Ulverston, Barrow and to Lancaster.

There is a lack of services for an expanding population

No petrol station

No supermarket

No near access to hospital and emergency treatment without involving long journeys

No Secondary school

No additional Primary School within the allocated area as laid down by the education authorities

There is a greatly increased risk of flooding particularly at the bottom of Kirkhead Road, Kentsford Road and Carter Road

I strongly object to the development of MN25M. The development of this scale is totally out of keeping with the local environment. 66% of the total allocated housing for Grange would be in this one area. The green space, supporting wildlife, and hedge rows was noted in 2001 by a previous Planning Inspector and this led to its removal from SLDC's 2006 Local Plan.

Why not see how smaller developments of housing progress before destroying a huge green field site like MN25M
