I am a resident of Quaker Fold, Ulverston and I am sending this e-mail in response the council's

proposals to allocate land near to Swarthmoor Hall as a potential residential area. May I point out the

following strong objections to the proposal regarding Site RN244? These points, I know, are shared by

all my neighbours who may respond separately.

- 1. Any proposed development on this site would massively encroach on the Swarthmoor Hall buildings and destroy their 16th century tranquility and attraction as a religious and tourist venue.
- 2. Swarthmoor village would become effectively subsumed by Ulverston and lose its individuality and essential separate identity.
- 3. Traffic levels in the area are already too high the result of extra housing would add to the congestion at the Cross-a-Moor junction with the A590 in one direction and add to traffic using Urswick Rd in the other direction. This latter location is already a site of frequent traffic collisions at the junction with Mountbarrow Rd.
- 4. Valuable and productive farmland would be lost further degrading the personality of the town as well as the rural nature of our local environment.
- 5. Many other brownfield locations are available locally to which all developers should be pointed first before Ulverston's unique and attractive personality is damaged by unnecessary urbanisation.
