This plot has been suggested by one of those people most affected by the original suggestion of rn152, to divert attention away from rn152 I oppose it for the following reasons : This plot is woodland that should not be cut down as it helps absorb carbon dioxide. This plot is covered over about 1/3 rd area by a deep swamp that drains into an underground stream within the plot. While this obstacle could be overcome, it would be expensive and could cause downstream problems. Building on this plot would extend the village boundary (it is not infill). There are inadequate sewerage and waste water services immediately below this area, which results in regular blockages and localised flooding. The local housing survey of about 2 years ago (with which the Parish Council were involved) did not identify a need for additional housing. There are already several empty properties in the village. The village has already undergone significant expansion in recent years with the building of small housing estates at Ellis Wood and opposite the Ship inn in Greenodd.
