This plot has been suggested by one of those people most affected by the original suggestion of rn152, to divert attention away from rn152 I oppose it for the following reasons : It is made up of 4 parcels of land, one of which is the churchyard. This is still active for worship and burials, how could it be built on ? A second parcel is consecrated ground which the church yard will extend into in coming years for further burials. The remaining 2 parcels are active farmland. Building on this farmland would contribute to potential loss of local employment. The farm of which this land is part is barely viable, and reducing the acreage further will not help. Building on this plot would extend the village boundary (it is not infill). There are inadequate sewerage and waste water services immediately below this area, which results in regular blockages and localised flooding. The local housing survey of about 2 years ago (with which the Parish Council were involved) did not identify a need for additional housing. There are already several empty properties in the village. The village has already undergone significant expansion in recent years with the building of small housing estates at Ellis Wood and opposite the Ship inn in Greenodd.
