

<p>Use of this land will <u>require additional access to A595</u> which has already been declined for Sand Gap. The Highways Agency is opposed to further access to A595.</p> <p>There is <u>no mains drainage available</u> for the site. We have recently contacted United Utilities for our own site and their engineers have confirmed connection to mains is not possible.</p> <p>The proposal includes our <u>private garden</u> for which the developers of Sand Gap sought planning approval which was declined.</p> <p><u>This is agricultural land.</u></p>
