

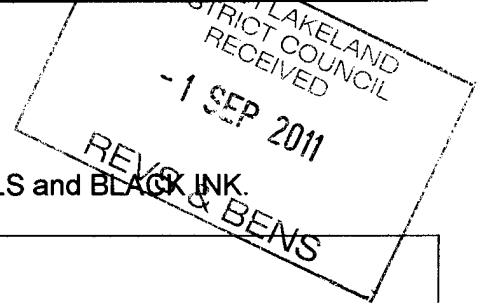

There is no road access to site except for a 12 foot wide lane between Strik House and Oak House. This lane is required to be kept open at all times by the Gas Board as a gas pipe runs under &amp; along the former railway line and could be damaged by large lorries carrying heavy building materials.</p> <p>2. Any vehicles would have to make a sharp right angular turn from the end of Barbrigg to enter it.</p> <p>3. It would be very difficult for an ambulance, impossible for a fire engine to get along it.</p> <p>4. The turning area in front of Strik House is required for that purpose including Rubbish Collection, Goods Deliveries to homes &amp; mail delivery, as well as entrance to the three houses at the end of this cul-de-sac.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">(continued) →</p>

5. We had a Village Survey earlier this year with 85% response on which a draft plan was based, ~~this showed that only so~~ regarding future requirements of the village. This showed that there was only moderate demand for low cost homes, with only small upfill of 1 or 2 homes. There is no wish for Town End to be joined to Barbon.
6. Any new development should be sited where there are existing services & utilities.
