<p>We have lived at this address in Barnrigg for 25 years. We understand the previous land owner, Mr. Meacham got planning consent years ago for the final three houses and "Stick House" the centre of the three was built just to prohibit further development.</p> <p>The narrow track between "Stick House" and "Oak House" was only intended as emergency access for the railway company to the bridge beyond. It is too narrow for regular vehicular use; it is hard to imagine fire engines/ambulances or other large vehicles using this access. We do not perceive any really sound need for potentially large development in this small, peaceful village.</p>
