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What do you think this brief should seek to deliver in terms of landscape, open space, green infrastructure or biodiversity?

We have all these things already in the existing greenfield sites. Any development should seek to preserve as much of the original balance as possible by using as much natural stone in the build and by using hard landscapning etc with low bristed impact and brotten up with green spaces, trees etc.

What approach do you think this brief should take to transport, movement and access into and through the site – including for cyclists and pedestrians?

This too has been enlarged but still proves insufficient at times without additional in-put. Also address problems of drainage + flooding as there are already significant issues for homes an Mayfield and field nearest Pear Tree Part is a very wer one in praces with a spring erc.

Have you any comments or suggestions on aspects of land-use (including housing and employment mix and type), layout and design principles that this brief should seek to promote?

I don't driver we need any more play areas as we already have 3 and they are very underused. The one off Maryfield seems the most popular and the 2 on Pear Tree are little used. There is also the large playarea next to the school which is by far the one where most children of all ages choose to go.

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Have you any comments or suggestions on community infrastructure and facilities required locally that could potentially be delivered through this brief?

It would be better to develop the site less intensively, allowing for sufficient parting space eve than to try to incorporate additional facilities which would mean that the housing provision is cramped. More could be done with the SLDC pulotic open space. It is not supposed to be used for dogs to exercise but heither is it much used for anything else. It might be nice to provide some peripheral trees / sears exe so that the area could be more of a focal point.

Have you any other comments, including on the Proposals Document?

Please remember the young people in the village who want to find housing that they can offers to live in. Also please try to ensure that houses built aren't used by weathy people to offer as hotiday homes or bought up to rent out for more than it would cost people to pay a mortgage. I know this is probably idealistic but it would be better for the village if you could do as much as you can to address these issues.
