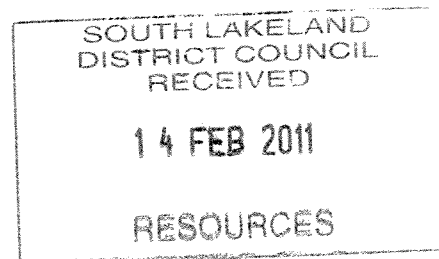

It is often waterlogged.</p> <p>ii) There is a much used flat footpath along the south side of the field needing the open space to the north.</p> <p>iii) The field actively acts as a wind funnel for the prevailing SW wind. Speeds have been up to 90mph.</p> <p>iv) A road junction out of the field would be dangerous at the junction close to High Knott Rd & Inglemere Close.</p> <p>v) The roads receive no gritting during icy weather despite about $\frac{1}{2}$ of Arnside's population (mainly elderly) living in the area.</p> <p>vi) The current sewage system, which would probably be used already causes problems to residence Redhills</p>
