<p>R150M - Development Proposal : I profoundly disagree with this proposal and fully support the comprehensive reasoning and objections by the Hayclose Residents Opposition Group.</p> <p>Location and steeply rising ground contour could well make this an inviable construction proposition. If carried out - access, potential drainage, noise, privacy & public transport problems, would probably generate a further <i>decline in quality of life for the majority of residents throughout the adjacent, densely populated Kendal Parks area.</i></p> <p>Any of the access route alternatives suggested would, directly or indirectly, affect Hayclose Road with even greater traffic volume. In recent years an increase in parked vehicles, including many large commercial types, has made it very difficult to negotiate and dangerous for drivers, pedestrians & children. Vehicles parked partially on foot paths, have made it a 'no go' area for motorised invalid carriage users, also causing problems for walkers.</p> <p>Since recent parking restrictions in Oxenholme Road, below the railway station where circa 30 cars were formerly parked by rail commuters, have now been relocated to the narrow Hayclose Road - some can remain for days (including a possibly occupied 'sleeper' vehicle). As a result, over 100 metres prior to the junction with Oxenholme Road is suffering, often being a dangerous, noisy, almost 'one way' stretch with blind spots. Difficulties with road sweeping and excessive potholes on one side, have arisen. The children's playground adjacent to Howe Bank Close would be a potential hazard area if an access route be made nearby for the R150M. Hayclose Road no longer appears to benefit from police foot patrol.</p> <p>Should the 'Strawberry Fields' area also be developed , the approach to Kendal from the South after Oxenholme, would then hardly impress anyone. Designated as "The Gateway to the Lakes " for potential tourists, it could well become known as " Kendal's Back Yard " - where have all the green fields gone ? !.</p>
