Q 12. Yes. Recreation facilities for young people.

Q 17. The AONB already has an excess of caravans. Current policies should be adequate to control further excess. However, such policies need to be backed up by rigorous implementation, including the monitoring of existing sites to ensure abuses are not occurring. The Councils will be aware of situations where such abuse has led to expansion by Certificates of Lawful Use.

Q 19. All existing open spaces should be retained. Middlebarrow Quarry could be developed as an open space, possibly with Local Nature Reserve status.

Q 22. There is always a tension between enhancing biodiversity and public access. Information boards providing information about key species, and the dangers of disturbance (particularly by dogs), should be erected at car parks in the AONB. There is an important education role here.
