Your comments

Sites 48 and 54 both exceed 0.5 hectares. Both lie outside the current development boundary of the village. Both sites are likely to throw up deliverability issues, and both would harm the landscape and visual amenity of the AONB. Site 48 would result in loss of woodland, and 54 in loss of agricultural land. Site 48 also contains surface limestone/limestone pavement.

Housing on site 55 would be visually intrusive, is beyond the current development boundary on The Row, and would result in the loss of agricultural land.
